He proudly wore the Wood Badge beads that he earned as a participant in the 2001 Wood Badge course in our Council. Most recently, Doc was recognized by everyone as the Vice President of Program for the Council.

Doc had an unparalleled passion for the development of young people in all ways and even more so with making sure that they had access to the opportunity of Scouting! He had "the juice" as he would refer to it.

Although Chris lived a very busy and active life, he always found time to go the extra mile when it came to Scouting; whether it was showing up to an NYLT banquet, summer camp leader's meeting, a Wood Badge course, a district event, or even just a phone call to check in on how things were coming along. He was passionately concerned that we, as a Council, were doing every-thing that we could to positively impact the lives of more young people.
