

Contingent Payment Schedule

By registering for the 2017 Black Swamp Area Council National Scout Jamboree contingent, you agree to meet the payment schedule outlined below.

Black Swamp Area Council is required by National B.S.A. to meet certain financial criteria to send Scouts to the National Jamboree and the local payment schedule is reflected to meet these requirements

The estimated cost is between \$1,300-\$1,600 for each contingent member. This fee is dependent on what the local contingent Scouts determine to have as its touring plan, and supplies for members, like t-shirts, hat, patches, etc.

Payment Schedule for the 2017 Black Swamp Area Council Jamboree Troop:

A non-refundable deposit of \$100 per Scout is due to BSAC at time of application submission

By Dec. 31, 2016:	a payment of \$250 per participant is due (total paid \$350)
By March 31, 2016:	a payment of \$250 per participant is due (total paid \$600)
By June 30, 2016:	a payment of \$250 per participant is due (total paid \$850)
By Sept. 30, 2016:	a payment of \$250 per participant is due (total paid \$1,100)
By Dec. 31, 2016:	a payment of \$250 per participant is due (total paid \$1,350)
By March 31, 2017:	a final payment may be due (depends on overall cost)

Frequently Asked Questions

What's the council Jamboree Refund policy?: If you sign up to attend and then cannot, a Jamboree refund will be processed only if Black Swamp Area Council has a paid replacement contingent member for your spot. The \$100 deposit is non-refundable.

Why payment schedule is important?: Black Swamp Area Council is required to make 3 payments equaling \$48,750 to National BSA for sending our contingent members (Troop & Crew) to the National Jamboree. These payments are due: January 2016 for \$8,750; July 2016 for \$20,000; and, January 2017 for \$20,000. If the council is unable to meet these requirements, the contingent will be responsible for the late fee, which is \$50 per person regardless of the individual's payment made to our local council, for each of the three payment dates.

What's the "Final Payment" mean?: This payment will be depended on transportation cost, potential extra touring/sightseeing plans, and other items that may be purchased for the contingent members like t-shirts, hat, back packs, water bottles, uniform patches, etc.

Will there be fundraising opportunities?: This is possible, depending on the need and volunteer help to organize and conduct a successful fundraiser, with council approval.

What's the non-refundable \$100 deposit?: This covers items like program material, service costs incurred by council during the planning stages and event. It also is a good-faith payment to hold the participant's contingent spot.

Who:

Scout Participant Qualifications

- Scouts and team members MUST have a current BSA membership with a Boy Scout troop or Varsity Scout team.
- MUST be at least a First Class Scout.
- MUST be at least 12 years of age by the first day of the Jamboree (July 19, 2017) or an 11 year old that has graduated the 6th grade, but has not reached their 18th birthday by the last day of the Jamboree.
- Be approved by the unit leader and local council.
- MUST have appropriate parent/guardian to complete the online parental consent. (An e mail will be sent to the parent/guardian during the application process.)
- Participate in pre-Jamboree training experience with local council and unit leader.
- Filed a BSA Health & Medical Record with their council within one year of attending the Jamboree. (The local council will provide specifics closer to the Jamboree.)
- Submit all registrations fees per the local council's payment schedule.

Venturing Participant Qualifications

- Crew members MUST have a current BSA membership with a Venturing crew.
- Be approved by the unit leader and local council.
- MUST have appropriate parent/guardian to complete the online parental consent. (An email will be sent to the parent/guardian during the application process.)
- Participate in pre-Jamboree training experience with local council and unit leader.
- Filed a BSA Health & Medical Record with their council within one year of attending the Jamboree. (The local council will provide specifics closer to the Jamboree.)
- Submit all registrations fees per the local council's payment schedule.

Scoutmaster Qualifications

All Jamboree Scoutmasters, First, Second, and Third Scoutmasters MUST meet the following requirements:

- MUST have a current BSA membership with a Boy Scout troop or Varsity team.
- Scoutmasters and First Assistant Scoutmasters MUST be at least 21 years of age by the first day of the Jamboree.
- Second Assistant Scoutmasters MUST be at least 18 years of age by Day 1 of the Jamboree.
- Third Assistant Scoutmasters MUST be at least 18 years of age by the first day of the Jamboree but not yet 21 years of age by the last day of the Jamboree.
- Be approved by the local council.
- Scoutmaster applicants MUST be currently serving as a Scoutmaster or Varsity Scout Coach.
- First, Second or Third Assistant Scoutmasters MUST currently be serving in any adult leadership position.
- Scoutmaster applicants MUST have completed Scoutmaster or Varsity Coach leader specific training.
- All adult leaders MUST complete Youth Protection Training within one year of the last day of the Jamboree.
- Meet medical and BMI requirements of the Jamboree.
- Participate and assist in planning the pre-Jamboree training experience with local council.
- Filed a BSA Health & Medical Record with their council within one year of attending the Jamboree. (The local council will provide specifics closer to the Jamboree.)
- Submit all registrations fees per the local council's payment schedule.

Venturing Advisor Qualifications

Venturing Advisors MUST meet the following requirements:

- MUST have a current BSA membership with a Venturing crew.
- Be actively serving as a Crew Advisor or Associate Advisor.
- Be at least 21 years of age by the first day of the Jamboree.
- Be approved by the local council.
- Completed Venturing Leader specific training.
- All adult leaders MUST complete Youth Protection Training within one year of the last day of the Jamboree.
- Meet the medical and BMI requirements of the Jamboree.
- Participate and assist in planning the pre-Jamboree training experience with local council.
- Filed a BSA Health & Medical Record with their council within one year of attending the Jamboree. (The local council will provide specifics closer to the Jamboree.)
- Submit all registrations fees per the local council's payment schedule.
