

Craftsmanship Outbound is a new Outbound this year that will allow Scouts on the Outbound to choose from different activities including making lanyards, pottery, leatherworking, and basketry. All Scouts will have the opportunity to design, carve, and paint a section of a totem pole to be completed throughout the summer.

Photojournalism Outbound provides an opportunity for scouts taking the Photography and Journalism merit badges to explore the professions in more depth. This outbound includes a field trip to the local newspaper. Scouts taking the merit badges will be given priority for this outbound.

En-sa-wac-sa Outbound will travel out of camp on the Tiffin/Auglaize/Maumee Rivers and sleep in a site along their river trek. Must be a Swimmer and requires a Paddling Skills Test. Over the course of their trip, the group will travel between 4-8 miles depending on the skill level of the group.

Recommended for older Scouts.

Field Sports Outbound involves new program activities this year. It will be true to the name through including opportunities for Scouts to practice Archery and Rifle, shooting Black Powder Rifle and Shotgun, and give the Scouts an opportunity to hike down to the shale beds for some fishing on the river.

Frontiersman Outbound will allow Scouts to experience the life of a frontiersman. Scouts will complete the overnight requirement for the *Wilderness Survival Merit Badge* by building their own shelters and spending the night under them. While cooking like the frontiersman, participants will learn a few old-style cooking methods specific to their Outbound. Scouts will also discuss the Principles of Leave No Trace and how they relate to survival situations. Scouts will need to bring a personal first-aid/survival kit. Scouts in the *Wilderness Survival Merit Badge* take precedence on this Outbound list as this Outbound is required to complete the *Wilderness Survival Merit Badge*. **Recommended for older Scouts.**

Glengary Getaway Outbound is a new Outbound this year that will allow Scouts on the Outbound to work together as a group to decide on the activities they want to participate in. Possible activities to choose from include swimming, beach volleyball, water polo, blobbing, water slides, stand-up paddle boarding, mountain boarding, boating, canoe tug-o-war, and fishing. Scouts will end the night by watching a movie in the Boat House.

Nature Outbound will allow Scouts the opportunity to explore, get dirty, and pick apart various parts of Lakota that very few Scouts ever venture into, such as the shale beds, the log jam, and Lakota's own wetland. Be prepared to stay the night with some of Lakota's finest wildlife. At night, Scouts can turn to the sky and look at different stars, constellations, and planets found in the night sky. Scouts will need a good pair of water boots, extra shoes, and extra clothes for exploring the natural environment.

Nicoteh Scouts will work to enhance their Scout skills while participating in a historical trek that teaches the lessons of early Scouters, including: Daniel Beard's "The Sons of Daniel Boone," Lord Robert Baden-Powell's "Brownsea Island," and Earnest Seton's "Woodcraft Indians." Scouts in Nicoteh will rotate between these areas practicing the many skills learned in class for rank advancement.
