Dear Friends,

Scouting is alive and well in Northwest and West Central Ohio. The Black Swamp Area Council had another great year in bringing the world's best youth development program to the youth of our 13 county service area.

At Camp Berry we celebrated 100 years of camping on Eagle Creek and dedicated the new Yammine Lodge. At Camp Lakota, final plans were made for the start of the long-awaited Cooper Lodge with Keith Hubbard Dining Hall and Armed Forces Memorial Parade Field.

This past summer our council sent a contingent of Scouts, including a patrol of female Scouts BSA members, to the 2023 National Jamboree. At Camp Berry we conducted our third summer of Adventure Camp. This is a program that has been growing by leaps and bounds.

As a council we had 11% growth in the number of new Scouts that joined Cub Scouts. The council also had a retention rate of 74.41% year over year. As we look forward to 2024, the excitement of the construction of Cooper Lodge, growth of new Cub Scout families, and expansion of our Exploring (work force development) program are on the horizon.

Your support, effort, and dedication to our youth development program make the difference.

Cooper Lodge Update

Progress continues to be made on Cooper Lodge with Hubbard Dining Hall and Armed Forces Memorial Parade Field at Camp Lakota in Defiance, Ohio. In the fall, the project went to bid, and groundbreaking occurred in the first couple of weeks of 2024.

Over the summer, the Defiance Area Foundation granted \$40,000 towards the project and the Bryan Area Foundation awarded an additional \$25,000 thanks to the Field of Interest Walter and Esther Jackson Faben Memorial Fund.



Several alumni of Troop 75 Defiance worked on raising funds to build a shelter house connected to Cooper Lodge to honor their long-term Scoutmaster Charlie Duerk. Charlie Duerk spent over 55 years as Scoutmaster of Troop 75 in Defiance, Ohio chartered by St. John Lutheran Church. Under his leadership over 100 youth reached the rank of Eagle Scout and many more benefitted from his passion and guidance following the Scout Oath and Law.

In addition, the Over-the-Top Brick Campaign raised funds for the Cooper Lodge. Individuals, units, and organizations purchased bricks throughout the year, which will be placed in a paver area as part of Cooper Lodge. Securing a brick at Camp Lakota is a way for an individual to inscribe their legacy on Camp Lakota.

We look forward to welcoming the community to Cooper Lodge, Hubbard Dining Hall, and Armed Forces Memorial Parade Field once complete.

ADVENTURE CAMP

Adventure Camp 2023 gave a true Cub Scout experience to every camper! Campers engaged in saying the Oath and Law daily, worked on completing Bobcat requirements, and had fun exploring many different Cub Scout Adventures each week. This year, each week had a different theme, allowing several families to attend multiple weeks of the summer. Additionally, our dedicated staff provided beads to recognize Scout character, create den/team relationships, and encourage campers to try new things throughout their camp week. Staff took LOTS of pictures and shared these moments with families who loved seeing their camper's experience! On our survey, one parent šaid, "Thank you for providing a wonderful experience that exercises children's mind, bodies, and emotions." Several families said their goodbyes the last week of camp with "We will be back EVERY week next summer!"



Overall from the year prior to 2023, we improved the program to keep campers and staff feeling good! Improvements included our own range and target sports separate from Scouts BSA, a morning "home base" for stations, and improved facilities and communication. Setting up our own Cub shooting ranges and having 3 trained rangemasters gave our schedule some added flexibility to accommodate staffing needs as well as scorching days. Utilizing Seneca Sam as a centralized homebase kept little kids from walking their legs off as we kept all morning stations under canopies in that area while still having access to running water and restroom facilities. Changing tents, walkie radios, snack storage bins, and canopies outside Seneca Sam cabin made camp easier and more comfortable for everyone! Staff who were walking with campers as "Trail Leaders" greatly appreciated being given a built-in mental health time each day without camper responsibilities. Program directors worked together to manage and maintain much of the program (ex., a clean facility, keep fishing gear more organized, ordering and organizing program materials, etc.) as independently as possible, greatly reducing the need for outside assistance. These improvements benefitted both staff and campers.



NATIONAL JAMB<u>OREE</u>

On July 20th, 2023, 60 Scouts BSA members and adult leaders from the Black Swamp Area Council and Erie Schores Council departed Camp Berry for the National Scout Jamboree! This year's Jamboree was hosted at the gorgeous Summit Bechtel Reserve in West Virginia for the first time since 2017. Traditionally, the National Scout Jamboree is held every 4 years, but had to be delayed by 2 years due to COVID.

As one of the BSA's National High Adventure bases, the Summit was built specifically for the Jamboree as well as other high adventure programs such as ziplining, white-water rafting, rock climbing, ATV experiences, backpacking 50+ miles via kayak or bike, hiking, trekking, shooting sports, and more!

Our Scouts spent 10 days camping with Scouts from all across the country as they celebrated Scouting's flagship event. With tens of thousands of Scouts, Leaders, and Jamborees Service Team members in attendance, the event showcases everything great about the Boy Scouts of America.

He led a team of volunteers to construct a Press Box for the Miller City Soccer Field. MILESTONES

100 Years at Camp Berry

On Saturday. July 8, the Black Swamp Area Council invited Scouts and community members to celebrate the 100th Anniversary of Scouts Camping on the banks of Eagle Creek, now known as Camp Berry.

Alumni were invited to bring memorabilia to be on display throughout the event and items to place in the time capsule that'll be opened in another 100 years! Guests were invited to tour the personal displays in Donnell Lodge and tour the brand new Yammine Lodge!



In an effort to secure a more permanent summer camp location, the local Boy Scout council leased 10 acres on Eagle Creek in 1925. In 1928 Mr. and Mrs. R. J. Berry purchased 83 acres, which include the original 10 acres for the Scouts to camp. The camp was named after the Berry's son, R. J. Jr. who had died in a streetcar accident on South Main Street, Findlay in 1915.

Yammine Lodge Ribbon Cutting Ceremony



Black Swamp Area Council officially opened the new Yammine Lodge Welcome Center at Camp Berry on June 20th, with a ribbon cutting ceremony hosted by the Findlay – Hancock County Chamber of Commerce ambassadors.

Bev Yammine and family celebrated the opening of this facility as the main benefactors of the building efforts, honoring Riad Yammine who was a longtime Scout supporter and community supporter. Mr. Yammine, who passed in 2015, accomplished many accolades in his life, including several high-level positions with Marathon and was instrumental in developing Emro Marketing, now known as Speedway, serving as President.

The new building serves the 360 acres just outside the southside of Findlay, where local Scouts and youth have been camping since 1923. The building now hosts the camp office, medical facility and meeting rooms.

Yammine Lodge is located at Camp Berry, 11716 Co Rd 40 Findlay, OH 45840.
