Registration Fee: \$5 per participant or FREE if the Troop Runs a station.

It will be the Troop's responsibility to design, supply props and run their station.

Site and description of station must be submitted to committee 1 week before camporee for approval.

Check In

Check-In Tent will be available from 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm on Friday at the front parking lot. (Sat check in available with notification)

At check-in, you will be assigned a camp area. Please be prepared to pay for all registration fees not yet submitted. We will verify the name and number of people in your unit attending the Camporee at the time of check-in.

1. Each unit will be assigned a troop camping area by the camporee staff.
2. Fire Wood will be provided by the Camp.

3.Each Troop shall have a roster with all attending Scouts and Scouters, and include any late arrivals and/or early dismissals. We need cell phone number for at least 2 Leaders attending the event.

4.Each Troop shall have the appropriate medical forms (BSA Part A and B only) for each person attending the camporee, and a medication form for all medications.

5.Each Troop shall have an up-to-date YPT Report

Checkout Procedures

- Troop campsites will need to be inspected before leaving. Look for a camporee staff member to notify that you are ready to be inspected.
- If your Troop is departing on Saturday night, arrangements should be made during check-in with the Camporee Staff at Registration for an inspection to be completed of your campsite late afternoon on Saturday.

General Information

- All meals will be the responsibility of the individual troops.
- Scouts should bring their own water bottles and should carry water at all times.
- A detailed event schedule will be provided at check-in.
- Troops are responsible for cleaning up their campsite and packing out all trash

ACCIDENTS AND INJURIES All accidents and injuries must be reported, as soon as possible after the incident, to the First Aid Officer and an Accident and Injury Report must be completed.

CODE OF CONDUCT:

These following rules are set forth to ensure all participants are safe and can experience the true enjoyment of the Camporee. This is intended to be a guide for Unit Leaders, Scouts, and Staff.

1. Scout-like behavior is expected at all times. All participants are expected to be true to the Scout Oath and Scout Law as well as National B.S.A. Policy and The Guide to Safe Scouting.

2. Two deep leadership at all times.

3. One objective of Camporee is to allow the Senior Patrol Leader, Patrol Leaders, and the Patrols to function as a troop.

4. Between Taps and Reveille, all Scouts should remain in their tents quietly with the only exception being emergency situations.

5. Scouts may wear a costume if they choose. They must allow for safe walking and vision.

6. Class A uniforms are expected at Scouts Own Service, and Closing Ceremony.

7. NO ROCK/STICK THROWING or other objects of any kind, inappropriate use of combustibles will not be tolerated. ANY SCOUT CAUGHT USING MATCHES, LIGHTERS, KNIVES ETC... INAPPROPRIATELY WILL FACE DISCIPLINARY ACTION UP TO AND INCLUDING IMMEDIATE EXPULSION FROM CAMPOREE.

8. INAPPROPRIATE AND CONTRABAND ITEMS:

Camporee Staff will confiscate any contraband item and any other items that are considered or deemed unsafe or inappropriate for Camporee. Firearms, sheath knives, fireworks, alcoholic beverages, non-prescribed drugs, cigarettes or tobacco products etc.

Trail of stations

Trail will start at Meechaway then follow lower trail to Pontiac campsite. From there go down the road and turn right at the directors cabin. Continue on the road to Pipe camp site.

Next head to the central shower house take the trail by outdoor skills and go to the chapel. From the chapel cross bridge back to Meechaway.

Troops may set up stations anywhere along this trail.

Groups will be sent out in 15min intervals.
