The current structure serving as the gateway to the Camp Berry outdoor education facility does not meet the needs for today's Scouts and Camp Berry facility operation. To remedy this problem, the Yammine Family and the Black Swamp Area Council have set forth on a fundraising initiative to



replace the
existing
camp office.

The new Yammine Lodge will serve as a training and administrative center for Camp Berry and provide a warm wel-

come to parents as they drop off their children at camp.

With Yammine Lodge's central location, will provide a great location for the camp's new health center. This will allow the camp to replace the currently outdated health lodge.

This lodge has been designed with multipurpose functionality in mind. Meeting spaces in the lodge are large enough to host volunteer and youth training education, merit badge courses, Scouting-related meetings receptions, and year-round use for corporate meetings and family gatherings. Users of the meeting space will have access to a catering kitchen, Wi-Fi and audio/visual equipment to support their functions.

Also included in the design is a business center for camp administrative staff and the camp director.

The Black Swamp Area Council has identified the need to build a larger structure to house a dining



hall and kitchen located in the center of camp. Improving camp is critical to keeping Scouting programs

appealing to young people, keeping them in Scouting longer, and increasing the benefits they receive from the Boy Scouts of America's proven program. Within Cooper Farms Lodge will be the Keith Hubbard Dining Hall, kitchen, and training space. The Cooper Farms Lodge will serve as the only four-season building in the 640-acre camp allowing Scouting to host volunteer and youth training programs all year long.

The existing Meecheway Lodge has served Camp Lakota well as the main dining and gathering facility since 1948, however the expansion of the camp geography, increase in camp participation and community involvement make the new lodge and dining hall a critical enhancement. With a new lodge and dining hall, Meecheway Lodge will be repurposed to host program activities.
