

Fort Amanda Canoe


Heather Barnes, cubmaster with Pack 2 in Spencerville, and her family own Fort Amanda Canoe and offer discounts for packs and troops. They are open 9-5 by reservation only. In advance notice is needed. The 5 mile is 1 1/2 hours long and is \$15 per person, the 8 mile is 2 1/2 hours long and is \$18 a person, the 10 mile is 3 1/2 hours and is \$20 person, the 12 mile is 4 1/2 hours and is \$20 per person, the 15 mile is 5 hours and is \$23 per person.



Discounts are as followed: - 1-8 people is \$1 off per person, 9-14 people is \$2 off per person, 15-20 people is \$3 dollars off. Payment in advance is needed for the discount and a rain date will be scheduled per the organization.
