Dear Scouters, Donors and Friends,

2022 was the year most activities returned to "normal". While there were many challenges in the return to normal, there were several real highlights for Scouting.

### **Balanced Budget:**

Our council again balanced the operational budget thanks to the generosity of our donors. In addition the council introduced a new coffee and tea sale to help fund local unit programs.

### **Eagle Scouts:**

99 Scouts achieve the rank of Eagle Scout.

During 2022 the Council Board raised \$1 million dollars toward the capital construction projects. Yammine Lodge at Camp Berry is nearing a June 2023 completion. At Camp Lakota Cooper Lodge with Hubbard Dining Hall with Armed Forces Memorial Parade Field has moved to the final construction drawing phase with groundbreaking slated for late summer/ early fall 2023.

### **Adventure Camp at Camp Berry:**

Adventure Camp had its second summer. The overall objective of this program is connecting community members both in and not in Scouting prior to their participation. Adventure Camp helps to deliver the outing of Scouting to all youth in the community.

### Youth Protection:

Scouting continues to have a robust youth protection training and volunteer screening process. All the tools that Scouting provides from the two deep leadership requirements, to the protect yourself rule in our advancement program, and criminal background check process.

Thank you to all of our supporters, volunteers, and donors. You all help make the difference in delivering the Scouting program to the youth of our community, making them prepared for life and leaders of tomorrow!





The forefathers of the Black Swamp Area Council and the Berry Boy Scouts Incorporated had amazing foresight to create endowments to help our council maintain a strong financial position.


The Berry Boy Scouts Inc. is a separate organization from the Black Swamp Area Council that was originally created to support Camp Berry. When our council became the Black Swamp Area Council the board of the Berry Boy Scouts Inc. enabled the trust to be used for both Camp Berry and Camp Lakota. Annually the Berry Boy Scouts provide about \$170,000 in support for council camping operations. Karl Heminger serves as the president of the Berry Boy Scouts Inc.

The position of the council's endowment enables the council to make the contribution to the survivor's compensation trust as part of the national council's bankruptcy without selling any camp assets. Both the council's endowment and the Berry Boy Scouts are on a 32 month rolling average for the distribution with a 5% spending policy.

The Berry Boy Scouts Inc. just finished up a 5 year commitment of \$250,000 toward Cooper Lodge at Camp Lakota.
